1. Welcome and receive apologies for absence

Aled M Jones welcomed everyone to the meeting after the original meeting scheduled for 8 June had been cancelled due to the General Election.

A warm welcome was extended to Cllr Richard Griffiths, Twrcelyn Ward, Cllr Gwilym O Jones, who had been appointed by IOACC as the SSG Representative, Cllr Roger Dobson, Llanbadrig Community Council, Tanya Hughes, Welsh Water (attending with Roy Chape), Mr Medwyn Hughes, Public Health Wales (attending with Sarah Andrews), Frances Taylor, attending on behalf of Rhun ap Iorwerth, and Cllr Gordon Warren, Amlwch Town Council.

The Chair thanked Cllr Alwyn Rowlands, who had stood down from being a County Councillor having been involved with Wylfa and the SSG for many years, as well as Cllr W Hughes for their support and attendance at Wylfa SSG Meetings.

2. Approval of the minutes of the meeting held on 9 February 2017

The minutes were approved as a true and correct record, proposed by R Dobson and seconded by Derek Owen.

3. Matters arising from the previous Minutes

Any matters would be discussed as the meeting proceeded.

4. SSG Chairman's Report

There had been two periods of Purdah since the previous meeting due to the Local Council Elections and also the General Election. This explained why the scheduled meeting on 8 June had to be rearranged to today. The main announcement during that time was that the Cavendish Fluor Partnership contract was to be mutually terminated by the NDA in September 2019. On that note, Nigel Lowe, Head of Programme for Magnox Ltd from the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority was welcomed to the meeting. The Chair advised the Site Stakeholder Group Members that he would be attending the SSG Chairs Meeting with the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority next week in Warrington and that he would provide feedback following that.

5. Wylfa Site Director's Report

Stuart Law was pleased to advise that there were no lost time incidents to report. However, in April, the site had been given an Improvement Notice by ONR to review the Asbestos Management Plan and ensure a risk based approach is used so that the site can demonstrate that it is tackling the highest priority items first. An action plan to address the asbestos Improvement Notice was subsequently developed and sent to the ONR. Following on from that, the ONR Conventional Safety Inspector had visited the site on 2/3 May to discuss the plan and check on progress, and a revised plan had been presented to the ONR on 7 June.

Daily asbestos monitoring is being conducted and to date no levels have been found to cause concern, but extra precautions were being taken to safeguard personnel by restricting access to the turbine hall and the reactor equipment building.

Stuart Law advised the Group that 150 samples were being taken on a weekly basis to ensure people were not being exposed to asbestos. But, ultimately, the asbestos needs to be removed, and a specialist company would be coming on the site to deal with the removal. As a result of this, approximately 90 additional people (Kaifer) would be coming to Wylfa Site, with the Turbine Hall being the starting point of the project.

Defuelling has not been progressing as well as expected. Three activities had been taking place – taking fuel out of Reactor 1, taking fuel out of Reactor 2 and filling flasks. There had been some challenges within the first nine months and at some points all three activities were taking place at once.

The simple aim regarding defuelling is to ensure that it is done safely and to make sure that Sellafield does not have to wait for fuel from Wylfa.

A project to recover fuel element corrosion debris from Dry Store Cell 4 is preparing to enter active commissioning. When entry is made into the cell, this will be the first time since its construction. Subject to the agreement of ONR, it is expected that the retrieval operations will commence later on in the year.

Sadly, there has been an increase in security issues across the UK and with this in mind Magnox is encouraging its staff to take appropriate precautions and to always remain alert. With regards to cyber-attacks, it was emphasised that no systems which control any parts of the plant are linked to the internet.

In a few years time, EDF Energy will be embarking on its AGR closure programme. As Wylfa is the most recent site to transition from generation to defuelling, the site was asked to host a visit in order to share the key lessons learned with EDF senior managers.

Manchester was the host city to 400 young nuclear professionals from across the world for the prestigious European Nuclear Young Generation Forum 2017 on 11-16 June. A group of 28 delegates visited the Wylfa Newydd site on 14 June as part of the forum.

The keys to Wylfa Sports & Social Club were formally handed over to Horizon Nuclear Power on 31 May 2017 and it was recognised that this has been an important community asset over many years.

Thanks to the tremendous support from the community and a £1597 contribution from Wylfa staff/contractors has funded a new wheelchair for a young local lady called Naomi Cooper.

Questions

Cllr Ken Hughes stated that it was disappointing to presume that there were inadequate measures for asbestos in place before the Improvement Notice was issued.

Stuart Law noted that he did accept there were some deficiencies, but he did not believe that people's health was put at risk. He explained that the monitoring may have been less extensive than it is today, but additionally he could not give assurances of what happened in the early years of operation at the site.

Tom Conway enquired whether Wylfa is the sole supplier of irradiated fuel to Sellafield. Stuart Law replied that there were two other sites, namely Dounreay in Scotland and Calder Hall, which is located very close to Sellafield.

Cllr Roger Dobson enquired about the current levels of personnel. Stuart Law noted that there were 304 members of Magnox staff working on the site at present.

Gwilym O Jones stated that regarding the Sports & Social Club, it was noted that it was important to remember that the building had also been a training centre for apprentices in the past.

Stuart Law agreed that this was the case.

Gordon Warren enquired about the changes that are likely to happen in staff levels in the future.

Stuart Law replied that there would be a gradual drift downwards, but nothing too significant, at least until the defuelling work had been completed. After that, it is expected that the number will approximately halve.

6. Nuclear Decommissioning Authority Update

Nigel Lowe presented the latest update.

There were three main topics to mention – organisational changes within the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority, termination of the Cavendish Fluor Partnership contract and plans in advance of the contract termination.

A new Chairman, Tom Smith, was now in post. He is a Member of the Institute of Directors and was an NDA Non-Executive Director from 2013 until he stepped into the Chairman's role. A new CEO, David Peattie, has also been appointed. He has an extensive background in the oil and gas sector. Both bring valuable business experience to the NDA.

The contract with Cavendish Fluor Partnership is to be mutually terminated, with the termination taking place in September 2019. Mr Lowe reported that this was in no way an issue of performance of either CFP or Magnox. The options moving forward were being considered and former National Grid Chief Executive Dr Steven Holliday had been appointed to lead an independent inquiry into the matter to look at lessons to be learned. The Secretary of State requested the review in order to be able to decide whether to run another tender competition or to alter the business model so that it is similar to Sellafield.

A team is working on this at present, in order to make a recommendation to the Government and it is hoped that a decision would be made by Christmas 2017.

Questions

Aled M Jones stated that when the competition process begun the SSG Chairs were assured that it was so thorough there wouldn't be any issues. But there are, such as time and money. Serious questions need to be asked in order to learn how things have gone astray. He also expressed his interest meeting with Dr Holliday.

Nigel Lowe was happy to take the comments back. He was in agreement that there are serious questions here, and serious lessons to be learned from the EnergySolutions issue.

7. Office for Nuclear Regulation Update

The ONR report was presented by Nick Blackburn.

Nick Blackburn advised that his plans for the future were to reduce his presence on the site, with the aim of inspecting two months out of three, rather than every two months.

Regarding inspections to date, no issues had been raised or found. There were no issues from a nuclear radiological safety perspective.

He noted that his colleagues in ONR had issued an Improvement Notice relating to asbestos, but emphasised that this isn't a Wylfa specific issue – it is a Magnox and nuclear estate issue. Another site would have received the same notice.

8. Natural Resources Wales Update

The report was presented by Paul Wright.

There had been a reduction in discharges since the end of generation, and there was no cause for concern.

An inspection at another Magnox site in late 2016 identified that alarm levels in the monitoring equipment used to clear waste from the reactor building had not been updated to reflect the most recent waste 'fingerprints'. A similar issue had been identified at Wylfa in December 2016. A site warning had been issued, and the response from the site was good and proactive, with corrective actions being put in place.

9. Wylfa Waste Manager Update

The report was presented by Stuart Law.

There was nothing out of the ordinary to report. The waste is leaving the site efficiently with up to 5-6 flasks being transported every week.

In addition, one container of asbestos waste leaves the site every week.

Questions

Gordon Warren enquired whether an incinerator was still operated on the site.

Stuart Law replied that the incinerator on site had ceased being used and had been shut down three years ago.

10. Socio Economic Scheme Update

Mair Jones gave a report on the Socio Economic Scheme.

The Magnox Socio Economic Video for 2016 was played to the audience.

142 organisations had been supported across the sites in 2016-17, which came to a total of £724,279.

Wylfa had 26 approved applications, with the funding awarded coming to £396.853.

A total of £38,892 had been awarded in the Wylfa area this financial year, with Benllech Over 50s Club, Ysgol Friars Outdoor Activity Club, North Wales Old Gaffers Club and the Menai Straits Regatta receiving funds under the Good Neighbour scheme.

The Môn Communities First Driving Skills Programme and Construction Skills Test Centre had received £37,372 for their third year of the programme under the Mitigation scheme.

It was also noted that a two week cycling festival, leading up to the Aviva Tour of Britain's first ever Stage 1 'Grand Depart' from Wales, had been supported by the Magnox socio-economic scheme over the past two years, and that the National Eisteddfod of Wales – which will be held in Anglesey in August – had also received support. Magnox Ltd is hosting an exhibition stand and a welcome was extended to all of the SSG Members to pay a visit if they were attending the Eisteddfod.

11. Open Forum Question and Answer Session

There were no further questions.

12. Any Other Business

The meeting closed at 1540 Hrs

1. Croeso ac ymddiheuriadau am absenoldeb

Croesawodd y Cyng Aled M Jones bawb i'r cyfarfod ar ôl i'r cyfarfod gwreiddiol a oedd wedi'i drefnu ar gyfer 8 Mehefin gael ei ganslo oherwydd yr Etholiad Cyffredinol.

Estynnwyd croeso cynnes i'r Cyng Richard Griffiths, Ward Twrcelyn, y Cyng Gwilym O Jones, sydd wedi'i benodi gan Gyngor Môn fel Cynrychiolydd y GRhS, y Cyng Roger Dobson, Cyngor Cymuned Llanbadrig, Tanya Hughes, Dŵr Cymru (sy'n bresennol gyda Roy Chape), Mr Medwyn Hughes, Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru (sy'n bresennol gyda Sarah Andrews), Frances Taylor, sy'n bresennol ar ran Rhun ap Iorwerth, a'r Cyng Gordon Warren, Cyngor Tref Amlwch.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i'r Cyng Alwyn Rowlands, sydd wedi ymddiswyddo fel Cynghorydd Sir ac i'r Cyng W Hughes sydd wedi bod yn gysylltiedig â Wylfa a'r GRhS am flynyddoedd lawer; roedd eu cefnogaeth a'u presenoldeb yng nghyfarfodydd GRhS Wylfa yn cael ei werthfawrogi'n fawr.

2. Cymeradwyo cofnodion y cyfarfodydd a gynhaliwyd ar 9 Chwefror 2017

Cynigiwyd fod y cofnodion yn gofnod cywir gan R Dobson ac eiliwyd y cynnig gan Derek Owen.

3. Materion yn codi o'r Cofnodion blaenorol

Byddai unrhyw faterion yn cael eu trafod wrth i'r cyfarfod fynd rhagddo.

4. Adroddiad Cadeirydd GRhS

Bu dau gyfnod tawel ers y cyfarfod diwethaf o ganlyniad i'r Etholiadau Lleol a'r Etholiad Cyffredinol. Dyma'r rheswm pam y bu'n rhaid ad-drefnu'r cyfarfod a oedd i'w gynnal ar 8 Mehefin ar gyfer heddiw. Y prif gyhoeddiad ar yr adeg honno oedd y bydd contract Cavendish Fluor Partnership yn cael ei derfynu gan yr ADN gyda chytundeb y ddwy ochr ar 9 Medi 2019. Ar y nodyn hwnnw, croesawyd Nigel Lowe, Pennaeth Rhaglen ar gyfer Magnox Ltd o'r Awdurdod Datgomisiynu Niwclear i'r cyfarfod. Dywedodd y Cadeirydd wrth Aelodau Grŵp Rhanddeiliaid y Safle y byddai'n bresennol yng Nghyfarfod Cadeiryddion GRhS gyda'r Awdurdod Datgomisiynu Niwclear yr wythnos ganlynol yn Warrington ac y byddai'n cyflwyno adborth ar ôl y cyfarfod.

5. Adroddiad Cyfarwyddwr Safle Wylfa

Roedd Stuart Law yn falch o gyhoeddi nad oedd dim digwyddiadau lle collwyd amser i'w hadrodd. Fodd bynnag, ym mis Ebrill, roedd y safle wedi cael Hysbysiad Gwella gan yr ONR i adolygu'r Cynllun Rheoli Asbestos ac i sicrhau bod dull yn seiliedig ar risgiau yn cael ei ddefnyddio fel y gall y safle ddangos ei fod yn mynd i'r afael â materion sydd â'r flaenoriaeth uchaf yn gyntaf. Cafodd cynllun gweithredu i roi sylw i'r Hysbysiad Gwella asbestos ei ddatblygu a'i anfon at yr ONR. Yn dilyn hynny, roedd Arolygydd Diogelwch Confensiynol yr ONR wedi ymweld â'r safle ar 2/3 Mai i drafod y cynllun ac i weld y cynnydd a oedd wedi'i wneud, a chafodd cynllun diwygiedig ei gyflwyno i'r ONR ar 7 Mehefin.

Mae gwaith dyddiol i fonitro asbestos wedi bod yn cael ei wneud a hyd yma ni chanfuwyd lefelau sy'n achosi pryder, ond roedd rhagofalon ychwanegol yn cael eu cymryd i ddiogelu staff trwy gyfyngu ar fynediad i'r neuadd dyrbin ac adeilad cyfarpar yr adweithydd.

Dyweddodd Stuart Law wrth y Grŵp fod 150 o samplau'n cael eu cymryd yn wythnosol i sicrhau nad oedd pobl yn cael eu hamlygu i asbestos. Ond, yn y diwedd rhaid cael gwared ar yr asbestos, a bydd cwmni arbenigol yn dod i'r safle i'w waredu. O ganlyniad i hyn, bydd tua 90 o bobl yn ychwanegol (Kaifer) yn dod i Safle Wylfa, a bydd y prosiect yn cychwyn yn y Neuadd Dyrbin.

Nid yw'r gwaith o wagio'r tanwydd wedi mynd yn ei flaen gystal â'r disgwyl. Roedd tri darn o waith wedi bod yn digwydd – cymryd y tanwydd o Adweithydd 1, cymryd y tanwydd o Adweithydd 2 a llenwi fflasgiau. Wynebwyd rhai problemau yn ystod y naw mis cyntaf ac ar rai adegau roedd y tri gweithgarwch yn digwydd ar yr un pryd.

Nod syml gwagio'r tanwydd yw sicrhau ei fod yn cael ei wneud yn ddiogel a gwneud yn siŵr nad oes yn rhaid i Sellafeld aros am danwydd o Wylfa.

Mae prosiect i adennill malurion erydiad elfennau tanwydd o Gell Storio Sych 4 yn barod i ddechrau datgomisiynu. Pan geir mynediad i'r gell, dyma fydd y tro cyntaf ers ei hadeiladu. Yn amodol ar gytundeb yr ONR, disgwylir y bydd y gwaith adennill yn cychwyn yn ddiweddarach yn y flwyddyn.

Yn anffodus, bu cynnydd mewn ystyriaethau diogeledd ledled y DU a gyda hyn mewn golwg mae Magnox yn annog staff i gymryd rhagofalon priodol ac i fod ar eu gwyliadwriaeth gydol yr amser. O ran ymosodiadau seibr, pwysleisiwyd nad oes dim systemau sy'n rheoli unrhyw ran o'r orsaf wedi'u cysylltu â'r rhyngwyd.

Mewn ychydig flynyddoedd, bydd EDF Energy yn cychwyn ar eu rhaglen i gau'r AGR. Gan mai Wylfa yw'r safle mwyaf diweddar i symud o gynhyrchu i wagio tanwydd, gofynnwyd i'r safle groesawu ymweliad er mwyn rhannu'r prif wersi a ddysgwyd ag uwch reolwyr EDF.

Bu Manceinion yn croesawu 400 o weithwyr niwclear proffesiynol ifanc o bob rhan o'r byd ar gyfer Fforwm Cenhedlaeth Ifanc Niwclear Ewrop 2017 ar 11-16 Mehefin. Daeth grŵp o 28 o gynrychiolwyr i ymweld â safle Wylfa Newydd ar 14 Mehefin fel rhan o'r fforwm.

Cafodd allwedd i Clwb Chwaraeon a Chymdeithasol Wylfa eu trosglwyddo'n ffurfiol i Horizon Nuclear Power ar 31 Mai 2017 a chafwyd cydnabyddiaeth bod y clwb wedi bod yn ased cymunedol pwysig dros y blynyddoedd.

Diolch i gefnogaeth wych y gymuned a chyfraniad o £1597 gan staff / contractwyr Wylfa llwyddwyd i dalu am gadair olwyn newydd i ferch ifanc leol o'r enw Naomi Cooper.

Cwestiynau

Nododd y Cyng Ken Hughes ei bod yn siomedig i dybio nad oedd mesurau digonol ar waith ar gyfer asbestos cyn i'r Hysbysiad Gwella gael ei gyhoeddi.

Dyweddodd Stuart Law ei fod yn derbyn bod rhai diffygion, ond nid oedd yn credu bod iechyd pobl yn cael ei beryglu. Eglurodd y gallai'r gwaith monitro fod wedi bod yn llai

trylwyr nad ydyw heddiw, ond hefyd ni allai roi sicrwydd am yr hyn a allai fod wedi digwydd yn ystod blynyddoedd cynnar gweithrediadau ar y safle.

Holodd Tom Conway ai Wylfa oedd yr unig gyflenwyr tanwydd ymbelydrol i Sellafield. Yn ei ateb, dywedodd Stuart Law fod dau safle arall, sef Dounreay yn yr Alban a Calder Hall, sy'n agos iawn at Sellafield.

Holodd y Cyng Roger Dobson am y lefelau staffio presennol. Dywedodd Stuart Law fod 304 o staff Magnox yn gweithio ar y safle ar hyn o bryd.

O ran y Clwb Chwaraeon a Chymdeithasol, dywedodd y Cyng Gwilym O Jones ei bod yn bwysig cofio bod yr adeilad hefyd wedi bod yn ganolfan hyfforddi ar gyfer prentisiaid yn y gorffennol. Cytunodd Stuart Law fod hynny'n wir.

Holodd Gordon Warren am y newidiadau sy'n debygol o ddigwydd mewn lefelau staff yn y dyfodol. Dywedodd Stuart Law y byddai'r niferoedd yn lleihau'n raddol ond dim byd arwyddocaol iawn, o leiaf dim nes bydd y gwaith i wagio'r tanwydd wedi'i gwblhau. Ar ôl hynny disgwylir y bydd y niferoedd yn haneru, fwy neu lai..

6. Diweddariad gan yr Awdurdod Datgomisiynu Niwclear

Cyflwynwyd y diweddariad diweddaraf gan Nigel Lowe.

Roedd tri phrif bwnc i'w trafod – newidiadau sefydliadol o fewn yr Awdurdod Datgomisiynu Niwclear, terfynu contract Cavendish Fluor Partnership a chynlluniau cyn terfynu'r contract.

Bydd y contract â Cavendish Fluor Partnership yn cael ei derfynu gyda chytundeb y ddwy ochr, a chaiff ei ddirwyn i ben ym mis Medi 2019. Dywedodd Mr Lowe nad oedd a wnelo hyn ddim â pherfformiad naill ai CFP na Magnox. Roedd yr opsiynau ar gyfer y dyfodol yn cael eu hystyried gan gyn Brif Weithredwr y Grid Cenedlaethol Dr Steven Holliday, a oedd wedi'i benodi i arwain ymchwiliad annibynnol i'r mater ac i edrych ar ba wersi y gellid eu dysgu. Roedd yr Ysgrifennydd Gwladol wedi gofyn am yr ymchwiliad er mwyn penderfynu a ddylid cynnal cystadleuaeth arall am y tendr ynteu a ddylid newid y model busnes i fod yn debyg i Sellafield.

Roedd cyfanswm o £38,892 wedi'i ddyfarnu yn ardal Wylfa yn y flwyddyn ariannol hon, gyda Chlwb dros 50 Oed Benllech, Clwb Gweithgareddau Awyr Agored Ysgol Friars, Old Gaffers Club Gogledd Cymru a Regatta Afon Menai wedi cael cefnogaeth o dan y cynllun Cymdogion Da.

Roedd Rhaglen Sgiliau Gyrru Cymunedau yn Gyntaf Môn a'r Ganolfan Profi Sgiliau Adeiladu wedi cael £37,372 ar gyfer trydedd blwyddyn eu rhaglen o dan y cynllun Lliniaru.
