1. Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from: Richard Foxhall, Jonathan Crawley, Richard Clarke, Gwen Pettifor, John McGough, Dafydd Jarrett, Nia Bowden.

New members Cllr Freya Hannah Bentham and Sioned Lewis from Seren Ffestiniog Ltd were welcomed to the meeting.

2. Approve the Minutes of the meeting held on 5 December 2016

The minutes were approved as a true record.

3. Matters arising from the minutes of the meeting held on 5 December 2016

Meredydd Williams – Maentwrog Community Council asked the NDA whether there was any progress with the Railway discussions. It was agreed to discuss this matter later in meeting.

Correction to the minutes - Paul Wright, EA/NRW was in attendance at the last meeting.

4. Chairman's Address – Keith O'Brien

The Chair commended the site visit taken prior to the meeting and that the removal of the administration block had emphasized the large scale of the remaining reactor building. He commented that the focus on health and safety and organisation of the site was evident.

The Chair had attended the SSG Chairs' Meetings in London in November, and thanked John Richards of Talsarnau Community Council for attending a stakeholder workshop in January, on the development of Welsh Government policy for the long term management and disposal of radioactive waste. Feedback from the meeting was presented by John Richards who also stressed that he had not received any correspondence since that meeting; i.e. the list of works and actions to be carried out. These should have been made available in February but had not yet received. John Idris Jones had also attended, and added that the workshop had focused mainly on consultation processes; feedback could have been delayed as a result of local and national elections.

The Chair announced that the NDA National Stakeholder event would take place in September 2017 in Cumbria.

Trawsfynydd Site Closure Director's Report – Martin Moore

Martin Moore presented a summary of his report that had been circulated in advance, drawing attention to the following: Good progress had been made on site for hazard reduction and safety; excellent progress made on the active commissioning of the NFED (North Fuel Element Debris) this in the past year as well as MSV (Miscellaneous Sludge Vaults). Routine work on asbestos removal continued as well as compliance matters. Performance on the plant had been done according to the schedule, safely and compliantly. Work would be ongoing for the rest of the year, moving then to post operational clean-out.

With regard to plant and structure programmes, i.e. cladding and removal of glass, good progress was being made on the Ponds Complex and Reactor Safestores by continuing to remove materials and completely disposing of the legacy materials that had been stored.

Work had been done on asset care, i.e. components on site such as cameras, drains and fire protection to ensure a level of confidence. Investment had also been made into appropriate security systems. Notable progress had also been made in transition to revised emergency arrangements, working along key stakeholders to ensure this was understood. There had been good feedback from the workforce on the new

arrangements and working patterns had been revised and scrutinised accordingly. Magnox was satisfied with the new emergency arrangements which were, as would be expected, confidential.

The site footprint had undergone a great deal of change, and some assets remained well beyond their lifetime. Key milestones were listed: the MSV have moved into routine operation; the two reactor safe stores are expected to be substantially locked down this year. The Ponds at Trawsfynydd, where the fuel and water used to be stored had undergone removal of residual activity for many years and the final cleaning down of these into configuration would be completed this year. Trawsfynydd was gaining a reputation as a reference site for Magnox, which was pleasing; the workforce was acknowledged for their excellent work and commitment.

Questions and comments

John Richards, Talsarnau Community Council asked if it was possible to receive a percentage of completion against progress. In reply, Martin Moore stated that the programme had been submitted to the NDA the previous year and that performance against the programme (up to 2022) was good. The aim was for 100% on wet pacified and stored by end of the year, and NFED to run to schedule of 2021 completion. It was a little early now to estimate early completion on this. Prioritisation of the progress plan was in place and an explanation of uncertainties within the plan's work was given. A high 90% region of completion against profile of plan was expected.

Questions and comments

John Idris Jones, Snowdonia Enterprise Zone thanked Martin Moore for the site visit, it had been good to speak with workers and their professionalism was commended. John Idris Jones asked if there were plans to take away more height from the buildings than in the current plan. Jonathan Jenkin (NDA) expanded on this in that studies had been done on early height reduction and continuous demolition, with information submitted to the NDA. There were two key UK sites where this might be possible, subject to funding, these being Trawsfynydd and Berkley, for different reasons. There was a long way before any decision could be made on this. There was an option for moving physical works forward, and if there was an aspiration from the Government for this, the programme could be changed, subject to funding. Jonathan Jenkin could not give a timescale, however in high level terms it had shown to be feasible and he was happy to provide an update on timescale when available. John Idris Jones believed this was very important, especially in the enterprise zone where prolonging employment on the site was paramount, and urged that the SSG support continual decommissioning.

The Chair thanked Martin Moore for the report and drew attention to the use of acronyms, asking clarification, especially as there were new members who may not be familiar with them. The Chair also commended the positive dialogue with the workforce.

5. Trawsfynydd Optimised End State Update – Ian Warner

Ian Warner reassured the group that work underway currently was a trial with no decisions yet made. A presentation was given on the GRR (Guidance on Requirements for Release of a Nuclear Site from Radioactive Substances Regulation) of the site from regulation by NRW (Natural Resources Wales), part of a bigger piece of wider work to find the best way to regulate sites in the latter stages of decommissioning. A timeline for works was presented on this bigger piece of work from Pre-consultation engagement in Nov-Dec 2016, with Royal Assent expected in the summer of 2019. Brexit had negatively affected this timeline with the likelihood that Parliamentary time to effect legislative changes could be delayed. To surrender the site environment permit, the operator had to demonstrate radiological and environmental safety and that the site end state was the optimised position. The NDA's involvement in the trial was explained. The Trawsfynydd site had been offered by NDA as one of three *lead and learn* sites, which would be used to test the draft GRR and flush out any issues. No decisions had yet been made and work was currently being carried out on assumptions, eg that the planned legislative changes would be forthcoming. Based on the trial works to date it was believed that a safety case could be made to leave waste on the Trawsfynydd site; this case had been developed and submitted to the Regulator as part of the trial with feedback expected in September/October 2017. Ongoing stakeholder dialogue would also continue as part of the engagement. A stakeholder workshop had been held in November 2016, where two options had been considered. 1 – to remove all waste from the site, 2 – some waste to remain on site. Overall, option 2 had scored higher.

Details of the next steps were listed i.e. Feedback from regulators on the technical case, continuation of stakeholder engagement, undertaking of further work on optimisation of the Site End States (SES), and what it could involve, further development of the required Regulatory documents, including the safety case as necessary through 17/18 and seek to agree a way forward in possibly 2018/19. The Trawsfynydd GRR timeline was displayed and explained.

Questions and comments

An explanation on the development of a SMR (small modular reactor) was requested from the floor. Martin Moore stated that site visits from several different companies had been made. The decision for moving forward with an SMR would be made by Government. Magnox would continue to support visits from any potential developers.

Idwal Williams, Trawsnewid commented that three inland sites were under consideration (Trawsfynydd, Winfrith in Dorset and Dounreay in Caithness) and suggested that there was potential for a great deal of funding for the Trawsfynydd area as a result of this project, should it come to fruition, which would increase local support. Ian Warner responded, stating that preliminary works had been done as part of seeking to make a case and this work demonstrated that over 6,000 HGV trips would be necessary to remove radioactive waste from the site, if this course of action was to be pursued. Ian shared his view that a technical case could also be made for leaving some waste at coastal sites as well as inland sites currently being investigated. Martin Moore added that he acknowledged the community need for local work, however Mr. Williams was seeking more infrastructure benefit to the local community as a result of decommissioning work.

Meredydd Williams – Maentwrog Community Council asked in terms of environmental impact, what the best option with regard to waste removal/storage was. In response, Ian Warner stated that in situ disposal was the best scoring option in terms of minimising overall environmental impact. Digging up and removing circa 75,000 tonnes of waste and moving it across the country to an alternative disposal site would have a significant impact.

The Chair thanked Ian Warner for his presentation.

6. Trawsfynydd Environmental Report (EHSS&Q) – Angharad Rayner

Angharad Rayner presented the EHSS&Q (Environment, Health, Safety, Security and Quality) report, noting that the Environmental Report was presented on an annual basis, therefore not available on this occasion.

The most significant work carried out since the last meeting had been the demolition of the administration block, undertaken with no issues arising.

A key piece of work approaching completion was the installation and commissioning of the North and South Fuel Element Debris Plant.

The old Standby Emergency Scheme had moved to the new scheme in close liaison with the ONR.

The above operations were additional to other work such as asbestos removal, site maintenance, drains decommissioning and waste control. A great deal of work had been done on this busy site without any major issues.

Considering the workload and complexity, a few minor important issues had occurred from which useful lessons had been learnt. E.g. management of ventilation sampling pumps, enhanced security at the main gate main gate, enhanced background radiation calculation in support of waste characterisation and re-evaluation of the relationship and communications with tier 2 contractors.

Safety campaigns were being developed, including working at height, standards and expectations, and behaviours and risk perception. In terms of safety leadership at senior level, work was ongoing to extend the effectiveness of visible leadership.

Questions and comments

Meredydd Williams – Maentwrog Community Council requested details of water sample testing from the lake in comparison with the river. The response from Sion Richards, Magnox was that care must be taken in how radioactivity was measured, as it would be higher in the lake than river, however reassurance was given that the levels were low. Meredydd Williams requested a graph of the lake results be provided. It was agreed that graphs could be directly provided by Magnox and Sion would liaise with Meredydd.

- 7. Report by Trawsfynydd's Emergency Planning Consultative Committee – Simon Dawson**
Simon Dawson was not present at the meeting, therefore the item was taken by Angharad Rayner.

The emergency scheme changes were explained; the emergency control centre had been moved to an emergency response centre in Pen y Bryn. The site had continued with exercises and on-site contractors assessed on their rescue abilities. In Jan/Feb, these practices were developed further to make them more challenging and to ensure everyone was aware of new procedures. A timetable of exercises was in place. Trawsfynydd was one of two sites aiming for 24/7 shifts by September 2018. Only security teams would be present on site during silent hours. The emergency services were also part of consultations on emergency procedures.

Questions and comments

Idwal Williams, Trawsnewid asked whether there would be a change to the number of staff following the move to the new shift pattern. Martin Moore explained the shift pattern, adding that there were no redundancies planned, however, some retirements may be expected.

- 8. Report by the Office for Nuclear Regulation – Nick Blackburn**

Nick Blackburn was not present but the report had been circulated to the SSG Members prior to the meeting. There were no questions raised.

- 9. Report by Natural Resources Wales – Paul Wright**

The report had been circulated in advance.

Paul Wright drew attention to the clearing of materials from the site; there was no environmental consequence, however one issue had been classed as a lack of control and a site warning give, i.e. lowest warning.

Good practice was highlighted with regard to the discharges from reactor 2; this was being kept under review.

GRR trial – continual interaction was ongoing with this.

Non-radioactive substances – there had been some waste from steam cleaning, which was within permitted limits, and site response to this was good

Questions and comments:

There were none.

10. Report by the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority – Jonathan Jenkin

The report had been circulated in advance.

Jonathan Jenkin drew attention to the most significant developments, mainly the termination of Magnox's contract with CFP (Cavendish Fluor Partnership) by mutual consent in September 2019.

The NDA had settled the outstanding claim with EnergySolutions and Bechtel to the value of £100 million, ending lengthy and costly court proceeding. This had been done with future interest of tax payers in mind. There would be an enquiry into what went wrong, to be chaired by Dr Steve Holliday, and initial contact had been made to discuss the scope of the enquiry, with which the NDA would fully cooperate. The timescale was uncertain, however interim findings had been asked for by autumn, which may have been delayed by the general election. NDA would update as work progressed.

Important personnel changes were noted - David Peattie had taken up his role as the new CEO and Tom Smith as Chairman.

The NDA had published its latest business plan for a rolling three basis and Jonathan Jenkin thanked those present for the local responses to the plan's consultation.

Question and comments

Meredydd Williams – Maentwrog Community Council asked whether the NDA had kept an interest in the railway line. Jonathan Jenkin confirmed that the NDA remained the owner of the asset and Network Rail managed access to the track. Jonathan Jenkin explained that his understanding was that NDA Properties had spoken to an interested party regarding the railway. The railway was of potential strategic value to the enterprise zone, therefore NDA Properties were retaining ownership as it may have a future interest the to the community.

Action: Meredydd Williams asked for a confirmation letter on this to be sent to Maentwrog Community Council in order to clarify the situation. An action was placed on Jonathan Jenkin to provide such correspondence

Ceri Stradling, Snowdonia National Park Authority asked if there were any consequences to Trawsfynydd as a result of the CFP contract termination. In response, Jonathan Jenkin stated that there was no impact from the decision and that it would be business as usual on the site.

John Richards, Talsarnau Community Council with regard to the settlement with EnergySolutions and Bechtel, stated that the NDA should be accountable to all tax payers. He believed that the situation was unacceptable and questioned why hadn't it been picked up before and questioned whether bonuses would be paid to NDA staff this year. Jonathan Jenkin acknowledged the astonishment and anger felt with regard to the matter and the initial report had identified mistakes with the tender scoring. The enquiry would look deeper than the initial report and judgement. In response to the question on bonuses, an agreed position had not been ratified by the NDA Board as yet, however no

corporate bonuses were expected this year.

A question was received from the floor regarding CFP losing the contract due to NDA errors asking whether there would be another pay-out as a result. Jonathan Jenkin stated that discussions were on-going between the NDA and CFP on commercial negotiation for the next two years' work. Martin Moore added that as an organisation, Magnox would stand by commitments against the contract and believed the plan was robust for whoever took it on in 2019. No distraction was expected.

11. Magnox socio-economic scheme update – Mair Jones

An update was presented by Mair Jones. An infographic had been produced for last financial year, copies of which were made available to those present. 142 projects to the value of over £724k had been supported in the last year. Examples of local projects that had benefited from the scheme were listed.

The next socio economic plan was underway, with few changes expected. SSG members were invited to visit the stand at the National Eisteddfod in Anglesey in August.

Mair Jones was thanked for meeting members of Maentwrog Community Council to discuss grants. Unfortunately, the community council was not eligible for funding on this occasion and had expressed their disappointment. Cllr. Williams stated that he would like to see more eligibility to communities in the power station's locality, more local input into the eligibility criteria as well as more investment into the local community, especially if waste was to be kept on site. Mair Jones offered assistance should the community council wish it and offered to convey his comments regarding the criteria. Jonathan Jenkin added that the criteria could be reviewed and that it was important to be flexible. However, as it was public money there had to be controls in place. Cllr. Williams added that other means of power generation invested more into their local communities than this site, to which the NDA responded that the Trawsfynydd situation was different as it was decommissioning and not generating power.

A video on the scheme was played and showed that Wales had benefited well from the socio economic nationally.

12. Environment Agency Report – Richard Clarke

Richard Clarke was not present but the EA/NRW Report had been circulated prior to the meeting. There were no questions raised.

13. Developing Trawsfynydd Site – Information Session – John Idris Jones, Chair: Snowdonia Enterprise Zone

An explanation was given of the two sites within the Enterprise Zone, i.e. Llanbedr aerospace centre and Trawsfynydd.

The Llanbedr aerospace centre was a unique site for unmanned and piloted aircraft and John Idris Jones explained the unique restricted flying zones over the region as well as details of the right environment for such developments. Nevertheless, much work remained to be done, including better access to the site. The UK Government's ambition was to create a space industry with a value of £40 billion. Funding from private industry had been sought to develop the facilities. Work was on-going to raise the profile of the enterprise zone and raise awareness amongst young people.

A slide was displayed showing the ambition for the nuclear sector nationally. A timeline for an SMR (Small Modular Reactor) in the UK was shown, from announcement of a nuclear research and development programme in 2015, to the next steps to set out policy to frame the assessment of one or more pathways for SMRs. The outcome of the expressions of interest in March 2016 had not yet been received.

Details of the development of the Trawsfynydd proposition were presented, including de-risking, with a number of studies showing that the site was suitable for an SMR. Positive engagement with potential vendors, developers and stakeholders was ongoing, however, progress was very slow.

Questions and comments

John Richards, Talsarnau Community Council stated that there had been mention of a bypass for Llanfair but not of a new access road to the site. John Idris Jones confirmed that a planning application had been made to the National Park Authority to move forward. John Idris Jones explained that only three sites in the UK were suitable for this type of development. Two companies had shown an interest in using Llanbedr for satellite launches with Government feedback on this was expected.

Roedd John Idris Jones hefyd yn bresennol, ac ychwanegodd fod y gweithdy wedi canolbwyntio'n bennaf ar brosesau ymgynghori; ac efallai bod oedi wedi bod cyn rhannu'r adborth o ganlyniad i'r etholiadau lleol a'r etholiad cyffredinol.

Cyhoeddodd y Cadeirydd y bod digwyddiad Cenedlaethol Rhanddeiliaid yr ADN yn cael ei gynnal ym mis Medi 2017 yn Cumbria.

Adroddiad Cyfarwyddwr Cau Safle Trawsfynydd – Martin Moore

Cyflwynodd Martin Moore grynodedb o'i adroddiad a oedd wedi'i ddisbarthu ymlaen llaw, gan dynnu sylw at y canlynol: Roedd cynnydd da wedi'i wneud ar y safle o ran lleihau peryglon, a diogelwch; roedd cynnydd rhagorol wedi'i wneud ar gomisiynu gweithredol y NFED (Gweddillion Elfen Danwydd y Gogledd) yn ystod y flwyddyn a aeth heibio yn ogystal â MSV (Ffawtiau Llaidd Amrywiol). Mae'r gwaith arferol i waredu asbestos wedi parhau ynghyd â materion cydymffurfiaeth. Mae gwaith perfformiad ar y safle wedi mynd yn ei flaen yn unol â'r amserlen, yn ddiogel a chan gydymffurfio â'r rheoliadau. Bydd y gwaith yn parhau am weddill y flwyddyn, gan symud ymlaen wedyn i waith glanhau gweithrediadol.

O ran rhaglenni cyfarpar a seilwaith, h.y. cladin a chael gwared ar y gwydr, mae cynnydd da'n cael ei wneud ar Adeiladau'r Pyllau a Storfeydd Diogel yr Adweithydd trwy barhau i symud deunyddiau a gwaredu'r deunyddiau etifeddiaeth a oedd wedi'u storio.

Roedd gwaith wedi'i wneud ar ofal asedau, h.y. cydrannau ar y safle fel camerâu, draeniau a diogelwch tân i sicrhau lefelau hyder. Roedd buddsoddiad wedi'i wneud hefyd

mewn systemau diogelwch priodol. Roedd cynnydd sylweddol wedi'i wneud i symud i drefniadau argyfwng diwygiedig, gan weithio â rhanddeiliaid allweddol i sicrhau bod pawb yn ei deall. Cafwyd adborth da gan y gweithlu ar y trefniadau newydd ac roedd y patrymau gweithio wedi cael eu newid ar sail hynny. Roedd Magnox yn hapus â'r trefniadau argyfwng newydd a oedd, fel y gellid disgwyl, yn gyfrinachol.

Bu llawer o newid yn ôl troed y safle, gyda rhai asedau wedi cyrraedd diwedd eu hoes. Rhestrwyd cerrig milltir allweddol: mae'r MSV wedi symud i weithredu arferol; disgwylir y bydd dwy storfa ddiogel yr adweithydd yn cael eu cloi eleni. Roedd y Pyllau yn Nhrawsfynydd, lle'r arferai tanwydd a dŵr gael eu storio wedi gweld llawer o weithgarwch gweddilliol yn cael ei waredu a bydd y gwaith glanhau terfynol yn cael ei gwblhau eleni. Roedd Trawsfynydd yn cael enw da fel safle cyfeirio i Magnox, ac roedd hynny'n beth da; cafodd y gweithlu ei gydnabod am ei waith ardderchog ac am ei ymroddiad.

Cwestiynau a sylwadau

Gofynnodd John Richards, Cyngor Cymuned Talsarnau a oedd modd cael canran o'r hyn a gwblhawyd yn erbyn cynnydd. Yn ei ateb, dywedodd Martin Moore fod y rhaglen wedi'i chyflwyno i'r ADN y flwyddyn flaenorol a bod perfformiad yn erbyn y rhaglen (hyd at 2022) yn dda. Y nod oedd 100% ar dawelu a storio gwlyb erbyn diwedd y flwyddyn, a bod NFED yn cadw at yr amserlen i gwblhau yn 2021. Roedd braidd yn gynnar ar hyn o bryd i ragweld a ellid cwblhau hyn yn gynnar. Roedd blaenoriaethu'r cynllun cynnydd ar waith a chafwyd eglurhad o'r ansicrwydd o fewn gwaith y cynllun. Disgwylir cwblhau tua 90% yn erbyn proffil y cynllun.

Cwestiynau a sylwadau

Diolchodd John Idris Jones, Ardal Fenter Eryri i Martin Moore am yr ymweliad â'r safle. Roedd wedi bod yn braf cael siarad â'r gweithwyr a rhaid canmol eu proffesiynoldeb. Gofynnodd John Idris Jones a oedd cynlluniau i leihau mwy ar uchder yr adeiladau na'r hyn sydd yn y cynllun cyfredol. Ymhelaethodd Jonathan Jenkin (ADN) ar hyn trwy ddweud bod astudiaethau wedi'u cynnal ar leihau uchder yn gynnar a dymchwel parhaus, gyda gwybodaeth wedi'i chyflwyno i'r ADN. Roedd dau safle allweddol yn y DU lle gallai hyn fod yn bosibl, yn amodol ar gyllid, a'r rhain oedd Trawsfynydd a Berkley, am wahanol resymau. Roedd llawer i'w wneud cyn y ceid penderfyniad ar hyn. Roedd opsiwn i fwrw ymlaen â gwaith ffisegol, ac os oedd awydd o gyfeiriad y Llywodraeth i wneud hyn, gellid newid y rhaglen, yn amodol ar gyllid. Ni allai Jonathan Jenkin roi amserlen. Fodd bynnag, mewn termau lefel uchel dangoswyd ei fod yn ymarferol ac roedd yn hapus i roi diweddariad ar yr amserlen pan fyddai ar gael. Roedd John Idris Jones yn teimlo bod hyn yn bwysig iawn, yn enwedig yn yr ardal fenter lle'r oedd parhau i gyflogi ar y safle am gyhyd â phosibl yn holl bwysig, a phwysodd ar GRhS i gefnogi datgomisiynu parhaus.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i Martin Moore am yr adroddiad a thynnodd sylw at y defnydd o acronymau, gan ofyn am eglurhad, yn enwedig gan fod aelodau newydd ar y grŵp nad oedd efallai'n gyfarwydd â hwy. Hefyd canmolodd y Cadeirydd y deialog positif â'r gweithlu.

5. Cyflwr Terfynol Trawsfynydd wedi'i Optimeiddio – Ian Warner

Cafodd y grŵp sicrwydd gan Ian Warner mai treial yw'r gwaith sy'n cael ei wneud ar hyn o bryd ac nad oes dim penderfyniadau wedi'u gwneud eto. Cafwyd cyflwyniad ar GRR (Canllaw ar Ofynion Rhyddhau Safle Niwclear o Reoliad Sylweddau Ymbelydrol) y safle o'r rheoliad gan CNC (Cyfoeth Naturiol Cymru), rhan o waith ehangach i ddod o hyd i'r ffordd orau o reoleiddio safleoedd yng nghanau olaf datgomisiynu. Cafodd amserlen ar gyfer y gwaith ei chyflwyno ar gyfer y darn mwy hwn o waith o ymgysylltu cyn Ymgynghori yn Nhachwedd - Rhagfyr 2016, gyda disgwyl Cydsyniad Brenhinol yn haf 2019. Roedd Brexit wedi cael effaith negyddol ar yr amserlen hon ac roedd yn debygol na fyddai amser Seneddol ar gael i wneud newidiadau deddfwriaethol. Er mwyn ildio'r drwydded amgylcheddol, roedd yn rhaid i'r gweithredwr ddangos diogelwch radiolegol ac amgylcheddol a bod cyflwr terfynol y safle wedi'i optimeiddio. Cafwyd esboniad o gysylltiad yr ADN â'r treial. Roedd safle Trawsfynydd wedi cael ei gynnig gan yr ADN fel un o dri safle *arwain a dysgu*, a fyddai'n cael eu defnyddio i roi prawf ar y GRR drafft ac i ganfod a datrys unrhyw broblemau. Nid oes dim penderfyniadau wedi'u gwneud eto ac mae gwaith yn cael ei wneud ar hyn o bryd ar dybiaethau e.e. y bydd y newidiadau deddfwriaethol arfaethedig yn digwydd. Ar sail y treialon hyd yma y farn oedd y gellid gwneud achos diogelwch i adael gwastraff ar safle Trawsfynydd; roedd yr achos hwn wedi cael ei ddatblygu a'i gyflwyno i'r Rheolydd fel rhan o'r treial ac roedd disgwyl adborth ym mis Medi/Hydfref 2017. Bydd y ddeialog bresennol â rhanddeiliaid yn parhau fel rhan o'r broses ymgysylltu. Roedd gweithdy i rhanddeiliaid wedi'i gynnal ym mis Tachwedd 2016, lle cafodd dau opsiwn eu hystyried: 1 – symud yr holl wastraff o'r safle, 2 – cadw peth gwastraff ar y safle. Yn y diwedd opsiwn 2 a gafodd y sgôr uchaf.

Rhestrwyd manylion y camau nesaf h.y. adborth gan y rheolyddion ar yr achos technegol, parhau i ymgysylltu â rhanddeiliaid, gwneud rhagor o waith ar optimeiddio Cyflyrau Terfynol y Safle (SES), a'r hyn y gallai hynny ei olygu, datblygu'r dogfennau Rheoleiddio gofynnol ymhellach, gan gynnwys yr achos diogelwch yn ôl yr angen trwy 17/18 a cheisio cytuno ar ffordd ymlaen, o bosibl yn 2018/19. Dangoswyd ac esboniwyd amserlen GRR Trawsfynydd.

Cwestiynau a sylwadau

Cafwyd cais o'r llawr am esboniad o SMR (adweithydd modiwlaid bychan). Dywedodd Martin Moore fod sawl cwmni gwahanol wedi ymweld â'r safle. Byddai'r penderfyniad i fwrw ymlaen â SMR yn cael ei wneud gan y Llywodraeth. Byddai Magnox yn parhau i groesawu ymweliadau gan unrhyw ddatblygwyr posibl.

Dywedodd Idwal Williams, Trawsnewid fod tri safle mewndirol yn cael eu hystyried (Trawsfynydd, Winfrith yn Dorset a Dounreay yn Caithness) ac awgrymwyd fod potensial am arian sylweddol i ardal Trawsfynydd o ganlyniad i'r prosiect hwn, os caiff ei wireddu, a byddai hynny'n rhoi hwb i'r gefnogaeth iddo'n lleol. Ymatebodd Ian Warner gan ddweud fod gwaith rhagarweiniol wedi cael ei wneud fel rhan o ymdrechion i wneud yr achos ac roedd y gwaith hwn wedi dangos y byddai angen 6,000 o dripiâu HGV i symud gwastraff ymbelydrol o'r safle, os gwneid penderfyniad i ddilyn y trywydd hwnnw. Rhannodd Ian ei

farn y gellid gwneud achos technegol hefyd dros adael peth gwastraff mewn safleoedd arfordirol yn ogystal â safleoedd mewndirol a bod ymchwil yn cael ei wneud i hynny. Ychwanegodd Martin Moore ei fod yn cydnabod angen y gymuned am waith lleol; fodd bynnag roedd Mr. Williams am weld mwy o fuddiannau ar ffurf seilwaith i'r gymuned leol o ganlyniad i waith datgomisiynu.

Gofynnodd Meredydd Williams – Cyngor Cymuned Maentwrog beth fyddai'r effaith amgylcheddol, beth oedd yr opsiwn gorau o ran symud / storio gwastraff. Wrth ymateb, dywedodd Ian Warner mai gwaredu ar y safle oedd yr opsiwn a oedd yn sgorio uchaf o ran lleihau'r effaith amgylcheddol gyffredinol. Byddai cloddio a symud tua 75,000 tonnall o wastraff a'i symud ar draws gwlad i safle gwaredu arall yn cael effaith sylweddol.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i Ian Warner am ei gyflwyniad.

6. Adroddiad Amgylcheddol Trawsfynydd (EHSS&Q) – Angharad Rayner

Cyflwynodd Angharad Rayner yr adroddiad EHSS&Q (Amgylchedd, Iechyd, Diogelwch, Diogeledd ac Ansawdd), gan nodi bod yr Adroddiad Amgylcheddol yn cael ei gyflwyno'n flynyddol, ac felly nid oedd ar gael ar hyn o bryd.

Y gwaith mwyaf arwyddocaol a wnaethpwyd ers y cyfarfod diwethaf oedd dymchwel y bloc gweinyddol, a gwblhawyd heb ddim problemau.

Gwaith allweddol a oedd bron wedi'i gwblhau oedd gosod a chomisiynu Cyfleusterau Gweddillion Elfennau Tanwydd y De a'r Gogledd.

Roedd yr hen Gynllun Argyfwng Wrth Gefn wedi symud ymlaen i'r cynllun newydd mewn cydweithrediad agos â'r ONR.

Roedd y gweithgarwch uchod yn ychwanegol at waith arall fel symud asbestos, cynnal a chadw'r safle, datgomisiynu draeniau a rheoli gwastraff. Roedd llawer o waith wedi'i wneud ar y safle prysur hwn heb ddim problemau mawr.

O gofio'r llwyth gwaith a'r cymhlethdodau, roedd ambell fater bach pwysig wedi dod i'r amlwg ac roedd gwersi wedi'u dysgu. E.e. rheoli pypiau samplau awyru, diogeled uwch wrth y brif fynedfa, cyfrifo mwy manwl yn achos ymbelydredd cefndir i ategu nodweddion gwastraff ac ail-werthuso'r berthynas a chyfathrebu â chontractwyr haen 2.

Roedd ymgyrchoedd diogelwch yn cael eu datblygu, gan gynnwys gweithio ar uchder, safonau a disgwyliadau, ac ymddygiadau a chanfyddiad o risgiau. O ran arweinyddiaeth diogelwch ar lefelau uwch, roedd gwaith yn parhau i ehangu effeithiolrwydd arweinyddiaeth weladwy.

Cwestiynau a sylwadau

Gofynnodd Meredydd Williams - Cyngor Cymuned Maentwrog am fanylion am brofion samplau dŵr o'r llyn o'u cymharu â'r afon. Ymateb Siôn Richards, Magnox oedd bod rhaid bod yn ofalus sut yr oedd ymbelydredd yn cael ei fesur, gan y byddai'n uwch yn y llyn nag yn yr afon; fodd bynnag, cafwyd sicrwydd bod y lefelau'n isel. Gofynnodd Meredydd

Williams am graff o ganlyniadau'r llyn. Cytunwyd y gallai Magnox gyflenwi'r graffiau a byddai Siôn yn cysylltu â Meredydd.

7. Adroddiad gan Bwyllgor Ymgynghorol Trawsfynydd ar Gynlluniau Argyfwng – Simon Dawson

Nid oedd Simon Dawson yn bresennol yn y cyfarfod, felly bu Angharad Rayner yn ymdrin â'r mater.

Eglurwyd y newidiadau i'r cynllun argyfwng: roedd y ganolfan rheoli argyfyngau wedi cael ei symud i ganolfan ymateb i argyfyngau ym Mhen Pen y Bryn. Roedd y safle wedi parhau i gynnal ymarferiadau ac roedd contractwyr ar y safle wedi asesu eu gallu i achub. Yn Ionawr / Chwefror, cafodd yr arferion gweithio hyn eu datblygu ymhellach i'w gwneud yn fwy heriol ac i sicrhau bod pawb yn ymwybodol o'r gweithdrefnau newydd. Roedd amserlen o ymarferiadau wedi'i llunio. Roedd Trawsfynydd yn un o ddau safle a oedd yn anelu am shifftiau 24/7 erbyn Medi 2018. Dim ond y timau diogeled fyddai'n bresennol ar y safle yn ystod oriau tawel. Roedd y gwasanaethau brys hefyd yn rhan o'r ymgynghoriadau ar weithdrefnau argyfwng.

Gwestiynau a sylwadau

Gofynnodd Idwal Williams, Trawsnewid a fyddai unrhyw newid yn nifer y staff yn dilyn mabwysiadu'r patrwm shifftiau newydd. Eglurodd Martin Moore fanylion y patrwm shifftiau, gan ychwanegu nad oedd dim diswyddiadau wedi'u cynllunio; fodd bynnag gellid disgwyl rhai ymddeoliadau.

8. Adroddiad gan y Swyddfa dros Reoli Niwclear – Nick Blackburn

Nid oedd Nick Blackburn yn bresennol ond roedd yr adroddiad wedi cael ei ddsbarthu i aelodau'r Grŵp cyn y cyfarfod. Ni ofynnwyd dim cwestiynau.

9. Adroddiad gan Cyfoeth Naturiol Cymru – Paul Wright

Roedd yr adroddiad wedi'i ddsbarthu cyn y cyfarfod.

Tynnodd Paul Wright sylw at waith i glirio deunyddiau o'r safle; nid oedd dim canlyniadau amgylcheddol; fodd bynnag roedd un mater wedi'i gyfrif fel diffyg rheolaeth a rhoddwyd rhybudd safle h.y. y rhybudd isaf.

Tynnwyd sylw at arferion gweithio da o ran gollyngiadau o adweithydd 2; roedd hyn yn cael ei adolygu.

Treial GRR – roedd rhyngweithio parhaus yn digwydd.

Sylweddau anymbelydrol – roedd peth gwastraff yn sgil glanhau ag ager, a oedd o fewn y terfynau a ganiateir, ac roedd ymateb y safle i hyn yn dda

10. Adroddiad gan yr Awdurdod Datgomisiynu Niwclear – Jonathan Jenkin

Roedd yr adroddiad wedi'i ddsbarthu cyn y cyfarfod.

Tynnodd Jonathan Jenkin at y datblygiadau mwyaf arwyddocaol, sef terfynu contract Magnox â CFP (Cavendish Fluor Partnership) gyda chytundeb y ddau barti ym mis Medi 2019.

Roedd yr ADN wedi setlo'r hawliad ag *EnergySolutions* a Bechtel a oedd wedi costio £100 miliwn, gan ddod ag achos llys costus a maith i ben. Gwnaethpwyd hyn gyda buddiannau trethdalwyr yn y dyfodol mewn golwg. Byddai ymchwiliad i'r hyn a aeth o'i le, ac a fyddai'n cael ei gadeirio gan Dr Steve Holliday, a chysylltwyd yn y lle cyntaf i drafod cwmpas yr ymchwiliad, a byddai'r ADN yn cydweithredu'n llawn â'r broses. Roedd yr amserlen yn ansicr, fodd bynnag, a gofynnwyd am ganfyddiadau interim erbyn yr hydref, ond efallai y bydd yr etholiad cyffredinol wedi achosi oedi. Byddai'r ADN yn rhoi diweddariadau wrth i'r gwaith fynd yn ei flaen.

Nodwyd newidiadau pwysig mewn personél – roedd David Peattie wedi cychwyn yn ei rôl fel y Prif Swyddog Gweithredol newydd a Tom Smith fel Cadeirydd.

Roedd yr ADN wedi cyhoeddi ei gynllun busnes diweddaraf ar ffurf cynllun treigl tair blynedd a diolchodd Jonathan Jenkin i bawb a oedd yn bresennol am yr ymatebion lleol i'r ymgynghoriad ar y cynllun.

Cwestiynau a sylwadau

Gofynnodd Meredydd Williams - Cyngor Cymuned Maentwrog a oedd gan yr ADN ddiddordeb o hyd yn y rheilffordd. Cadarnhaodd Jonathan Jenkin mai'r ADN oedd perchennog yr ased o hyd a bod Network Rail yn rheoli mynediad i'r trac. Eglurodd Jonathan Jenkin ei fod ar ddeall bod NDA Properties wedi siarad â pharti sydd â diddordeb ynglŷn â'r rheilffordd. Roedd gan y rheilffordd werth strategol posibl i'r ardal fenter, ac felly roedd NDA Properties yn cadw perchnogaeth oherwydd y posibilrwydd y gallai fod o fudd i'r gymuned yn y dyfodol.

Cam Gweithredu: Gwnaeth Meredydd Williams gais i lythyr cadarnhau ar y mater gael ei anfon at Gyngor Cymuned Maentwrog i egluro'r sefyllfa. Gofynnwyd i Jonathan Jenkin fod yn gyfrifol am yr ohebiaeth honno.

Gofynnodd Ceri Stradling, Awdurdod Parc Cenedlaethol Eryri a oedd unrhyw ganlyniadau i Drawsfynydd o ganlyniad i derfynu'r contract â CFP. Yn ei ymateb, dywedodd Jonathan Jenkin nad oedd y penderfyniad yn effeithio ar Drawsfynydd ac y byddai'r gwaith ar y safle'n mynd yn ei flaen fel arfer.

Dyweddodd John Richards, Cyngor Cymuned Talsarnau wrth sôn am setliad ag EnergySolutions a Bechtel, y dylai'r ADN fod yn atebol i'r holl drethdalwyr. Roedd yn credu bod y sefyllfa'n annerbyniol a gofynnodd pam nad oedd neb wedi tynnu sylw at y mater yn gynharach a gofynnodd a fyddai bonysau'n cael eu talu i staff yr ADN eleni. Roedd Jonathan Jenkin yn cydnabod y syndod a'r dicter a fynegwyd ynglŷn â'r mater a bod yr adroddiad rhagarweiniol wedi amlygu camgymeriadau a wnaethpwyd wrth sgorio'r tendr. Byddai'r ymchwiliad yn edrych yn fwy manwl na'r adroddiad a'r dyfarniad rhagarweiniol. Mewn ymateb i'r cwestiwn am y bonysau, nid oedd y sefyllfa wedi'i chadarnhau gan Fwrdd yr ADN eto; fodd bynnag, ni ddisgwylid dim bonysau corfforaethol eleni.

Cafwyd cwestiwn o'r llawr yn ymwneud â'r ffaith bod CFP wedi colli'r contract oherwydd camgymeriadau'r ADN a gofynnwyd a fyddai'n rhaid gwneud taliad arall o ganlyniad. Dywedodd Jonathan Jenkin fod trafodaethau'n parhau rhwng yr ADN a CFP ar negodiadau ar gyfer gwaith y ddwy flynedd nesaf. Ychwanegodd Martin Moore y byddai Magnox, fel sefydliad, yn anrhydeddu ymrwymadau yn erbyn y contract ac roedd yn credu bod y cynllun yn un cadarn ar gyfer pwy bynnag a fyddai'n ymgymryd â'r gwaith yn 2019. Nid oedd disgwyl i hyn amharu ar y gwaith.

11. Diweddariad ar gynllun economaidd gymdeithasol Magnox – Mair Jones

Cyflwynwyd diweddariad gan Mair Jones. Roedd ffeithlun wedi'i gynhyrchu ar gyfer y flwyddyn ariannol ddiwethaf, ac roedd copiâu ar gael i'r sawl oedd yn bresennol. Roedd 142 o brosiectau, gyda gwerth o fwy na £724k wedi cael cefnogaeth yn y flwyddyn ddiwethaf. Rhestrwyd enghreifftiau o brosiectau lleol a oedd wedi elwa ar y cynllun.

Roedd y cynllun economaidd gymdeithasol nesaf yn yr arfaeth, ac roedd disgwyl ychydig o newidiadau. Gwahoddwyd aelodau'r Grŵp i ymweld â'r stondin ar Faes yr Eisteddfod Genedlaethol ym Môn ym mis Awst.

Diolchwyd i Mair Jones am gwrdd ag aelodau Cyngor Cymuned Maentwrog i drafod grantiau. Yn anffodus, nod oedd y cyngor cymuned yn gymwys i gael cyllid ar yr adeg hon ac roeddent wedi mynegi eu siom. Dywedodd y Cyng. Williams yr hoffai weld mwy o gymunedau'n gymwys yng nghyffiniau'r orsaf bŵer, gyda mwy o gyfle i gymunedau lleol ddylanwadu ar y meini prawf cymhwysedd yn ogystal â mwy o fuddsoddiad yn y gymuned leol, yn enwedig os bydd gwastraff yn cael ei gadw ar y safle. Cynigiodd Mair Jones gymorth pe byddai'r cyngor cymuned yn dymuno a chynigiodd gyfleu ei sylwadau ynglŷn â'r meini prawf. Ychwanegodd Jonathan Jenkin y gellid adolygu'r meini prawf a'i bod yn bwysig bod yn hyblyg. Fodd bynnag, gan ei fod yn arian cyhoeddus roedd yn rhaid cael mesurau rheoli. Ychwanegodd y Cyng. 13. Datblygu Safle Trawsfynydd – Sesiwn Wybodaeth – John Idris Jones, Cadeirydd: Ardal Fenter Eryri

Cafwyd manylion am y ddau safle sydd o fewn yr Ardal Fenter, sef canolfan awyrofod Llanbedr a Thrawsfynydd.

Roedd canolfan awyrofod Llanbedr yn safle unigryw ar gyfer awyrennau di-griw ac awyrennau â pheilotiaid ac eglurodd John Idris Jones fanylion am y parthau hedfan cyfyngedig unigryw uwchben yr ardal yn ogystal â gwybodaeth am yr amgylchedd cywir ar gyfer datblygiadau o'r fath. Er hynny, roedd llawer o waith i'w wneud o hyd, gan gynnwys gwell mynediad i'r safle. Uchelgais Llywodraeth y DU oedd creu diwydiant gofod a fyddai'n werth £40 biliwn.
